

Exhibitions-- Books open at 5:45

Exhibitions start at 6:00 --- Exhibitions will be suspended at 7:45 -- Exhibition Fees - \$4.00 ea.

We should be able to accommodate 50 to 60 Exhibitions prior to the start of the Barrel Race and will be distributed on a first comfirst serve basis.

Exhibitions may be resumed after the Barrel Race if participants desire to continue riding.

4-D Open Barrel Race

OPEN starts at 8:00PM -- Fees are \$25.00 per horse.

Riders may run as many horses as they wish to pay entry fees, but ONLY ONE run per horse.

YOUTH to follow Open at \$15.00 per horse in the Youth. Riders may run as many horses as they wish to pay entry fees, but ONLY ONE run per horse.

(YOUTH Class will consist of rider's AASP&RC Junior age division and under)

*Awards will consist of Jackpot payouts for both Open and Youth

Saturday morning OPEN Jackpot Playday

Grand Entry will start 9:00 -- PlayDay will start at 9:30

OPEN Jackpot Playday will be run in appropriate AASP&RC age Classes

Fees - \$30.00 for the day for first horse/rider combo for all 5 events -- Additional horses, Fees are \$5.00 per horse per event.

Events to be run at Spring Roundup are Barrels and Poles with the last 3 events drawn and announced Saturday morning.

*Riders may enter as many horses as they wish, but ONLY ONE run per horse per event.

*Awards will consist of Jackpot payouts per age group per event.

*Saddles will be awarded as follows: Adult (Intermediates and older), fastest accumulated times of the day. Youth (Junior and younger), fastest accumulated times of the day.



*For those wishing to run more than one horse, to be eligible for the saddle, you will receive one running time per event and that will be your fastest time in the that event.

Sunday morning Trail Ride FREE of charge for all those that wish to participate.


